How to get here: Drive north on Interstate 95 from Boston. In Maine, I-95 becomes the Maine Turnpike. Just beyond Portland, take exit Mile 52 (you leave the turnpike) to I-295 north to Brunswick, and take exit 28 onto Coastal Route 1. Follow Route 1 through Brunswick, Bath, and Wiscasset. After crossing the bridge just beyond Wiscasset, turn right onto Route 27 towards Boothbay Harbor. Continue about 12 miles and, just before entering the business district, turn left at the traffic light onto Route 96 (East Boothbay–Ocean Point). Follow Route 96 for about 6 1/2 miles to Ocean Point, and turn right onto Middle Road. At the bottom of Middle Road, turn right onto Shore Road to the inn.
